Quorum Needed!

At our September Civic meeting, we only had 25 homes represented. This means that no business could be done. This is YOUR community... OUR community... and we should all be participating in order to keep the flow of business and upkeep. We want our community to be its best, and that takes everyone's commitment and assistance.

At the October meeting, we need to take a vote on reducing the number of Board members from 10 to 9. As was stated in last month's Newsletter, this is to effect better business practices and now is the time as elections will take place. The Board voted in September to move the Publicity Chair to a committee chair who will report to the Board and Civic community. We were hoping to have this voted on at the September Civic meeting as our documents require this to be a vote of the community at a meeting where a quorum is established. PLEASE BE SURE TO ATTEND THE OCTOBER MEET-ING so that we can vote on this BEFORE elections.

The other issue we discussed was a rebuilding of our irrigation pump to include controls. This has been recommended to reduce mainline breaks. One bid has been almost \$30,000, so we are seeking two other bids as our Documents require. These may be ready for the next meeting, so I wanted to inform the community in case.

Pool Chillers

As I said in the last Newsletter, our pool guy has found a way to add reverse systems to produce chillers with our existing heater units. Parts are ordered and waiting arrival at a cost of \$2,400, which includes the labor to have it installed. Hopefully, this will happen soon.

Special Guests

We had Sammie Monroe and Charlene Nevadomski from Tamarac Parks and Recreation at our meeting and they did a great job of telling us what is available in the City. They also left us surveys






