Address Violations and Respond!

Courtesy letters are the first letter to be sent when a violation is reported and confirmed. If you receive a Courtesy Letter, please respond to me in

writing by letter or email at katejohnsonms4@gmail.com. If you do not respond to that Courtesy Letter, I do not know if you are addressing the violation. Then, I send an actual Violation Letter. Things escalate from there.

It is in your best interest to address things up front. We will work with you as we can to address these violations. However, they must be addressed. Believe me, it is much more expensive for you if the attorney gets involved. It behooves you to address it early.

NOTICE TO RENTERS AND OWNERS WHO RENT

Did you know that according to our Governing Documents, leases are to be renewed annually and we are to receive a copy of the lease? Yes, that's right.

If you are a renter, please inform your landlord to send us a copy of your lease. If you are a landlord, please send us a copy of the current lease.

All tenants/renters MUST be approved by the Board BEFORE they can lease a home, so if you have renters or are one and you have not gone

through the application process, background check, and interview, then your lease and ability to remain in the home are in jeopardy. We can and will begin an eviction process if necessary.

Do your part and protect your occupancy by letting us know you are there or have a lease. You can leave a copy of the lease in the Clubhouse Mailbox. You can also contact us by email at katejohn-sonms4@gmail.com or at mainlandssec4interview@gmail.com.

IN ADDTION, ALL ADDITIONAL OCCUPANTS MUST GO THROUGH THE SAME PROCESS.

NO ONE should be living in Mainlands that we do not have information on. That means if you have someone living with you who is over 18 (because of course no one under 18 can live here) and they have been here or planning on being here for more than 30 days PER YEAR, please ask for an Additional Occupant Application and it will be sent to you. 

Librarian's Report: Jim Cogswell


WHERE DOES OUR LIBRARY GET THE BOOKS? DONATIONS ARE GRATE-**FULLY ACCEPTED.**

Scammers Targeting Older Citizens

People are calling claiming to be from a utility company, such as FP&L. They threaten to shut off power if the payment is not received in a certain amount of time. Scammers often ask for certain personal account information or demand that payment be sent, sometimes in the form of a prepaid card. Scammers are even "spoofing" telephone numbers to make it appear it is coming from the utility company. They can also use a fake number and use our area codes. This is done through computer programs designed for that purpose.

If you doubt the identity of someone claiming to be from a utility company, hang up and call the utility company directly. DO NOT USE THE NUMBER THE SCAMMER PROVIDES YOU WITH. Here are a few tips to take control of the situation if you are targeted by a scam:

- **Take your time**. Scammers try to create a sense of urgency so that you'll act fast and hand over personal information, especially by phone. Take time to think before acting.
- **Be suspicious.** Scammers typically request immediate payment through prepaid debit cards or third party apps. Unusual requests like this should raise red flags. If the request seems strange or out of the ordinary, you're likely being targeted by a scammer.
- **Confirm before you act.** If you're contacted by someone claiming to represent a utility company, or any other company that services you, but you are unsure, just hand up and call the utility directly. Never use the number they give you. The company will verify if there is anything wrong with your account.

Stay alert and stay informed.



NEW ENERGY TECHNOLOGY in TAMARAC

ROOF TOP ELECTRICITY FROM THE SUN

One of our residents recently had installed a roof-top solar panel array consisting of photovoltaic semiconductors as shown in the diagram. The sunlight excites the electrons inside the specialized silicon semiconductors and thereby generates a current. The installation was complete in one day. The company also included a 25 year warranty and a special coverage for storm damage. There were no up-front charges to the customer. The estimated monthly payment for the system is significantly less than the conventional FPL account bill.

An Energy Tax incentive is calculated into the ultimate cost of the system.

In view of the planet's ongoing crisis in carbon emissions and global warming, it is expected that this kind of system will rapidly replace the conventional system of power supplied solely by remote utility.
