The board voted to let Zach replace the old heads as they break with popups, at his cost. Zach is fixing and replacing heads as things break.

Talk About the Town by Kate Johnson

So much growth in Tamarac is planned. Your best bet is to be informed of the plans the city is considering. In an effort to let residents know, Tamarac Neighborhood meetings are beginning. Consider attending as many as you can because each commissioner needs to hear what you have to say as their votes on each item affect us all. They will only be attending their own district meeting.

Four important topics that need to be brought up:

Cheddars property proposal for apartments – they are considering a proposal to build a lower floor with restaurants and 5 floors on top, which will include 278 new apartments.

Shaker Village – still on the table to spend \$10-12 million of our dollars to tear down what's left of their clubhouse and rebuild a small "community center" for the east side of Tamarac, which we do not need.

Colony West Golf Course – plans are under consideration to revamp/improve the golf course to make it more profitable, and local residents are not happy.

Tamarac Village Phase 3 – this is the part of the project where new upscale shopping and restaurants were to be built. Now, it seems builders will only consider it if they are allowed to build apartments above the shopping. Hundreds of new apartments will be added.

All of these issue are vital to address. The Neighborhood Meetings are 6:30 to 8:30 pm on th following days:

May 13th - District 3 Kings Point, Palace Theater, 7620 N. Nob Hill Rd


